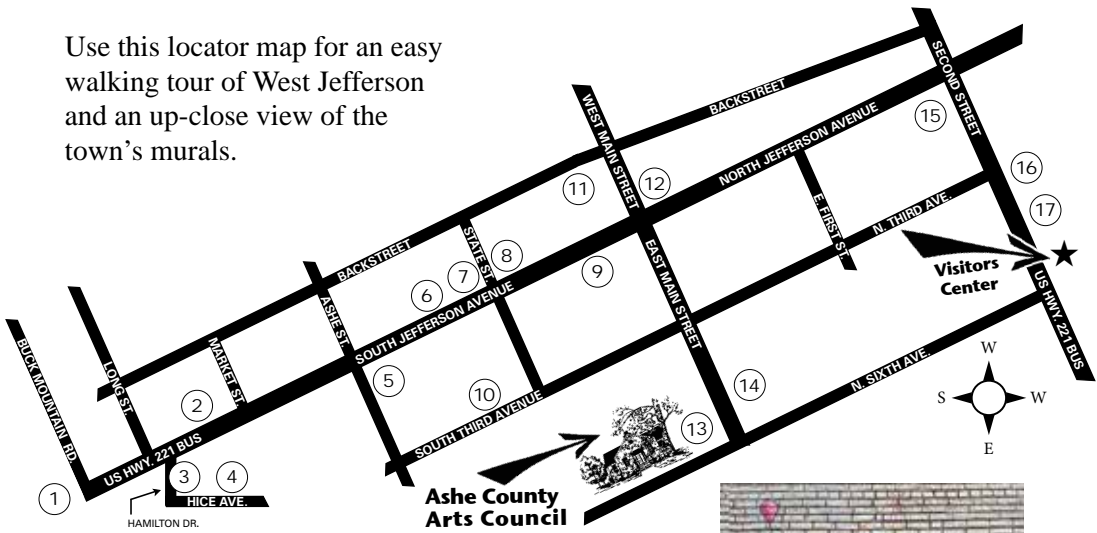

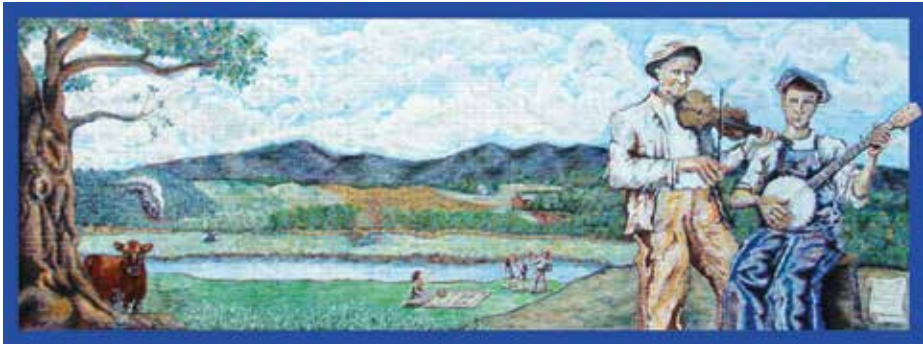

Ashe County is the home of iconic works of art by internationally renowned fresco artist, Ben Long. Between 1970 and 1980, Long created magnificent, enduring works in two historic local churches.

The first frescoes, "Mary Great with Child," "John the Baptist," and "The Mystery of Faith," are in the small sanctuary of St. Mary's Episcopal Church in West Jefferson. Long then created a life-sized depiction of "The Last Supper" in Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Glendale Springs, using local residents as models.

Thousands of people visit the frescoes each year. Both churches are open for visitors 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

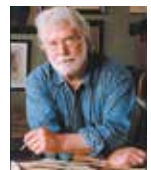

MUSEUM OF ASHE COUNTY HISTORY

Founded in 2002, the museum is housed in the historic 1904 County Courthouse in Jefferson. Materials for the original building came from local sources. Today it is the home of the Virginia Creeper Train diorama, other historic exhibits, a Victory Garden, concerts, festivals, and historic tours.
